**Connor Jones** for entering a variety of prize winning vegetables in the produce section including some super pumpkins that even beat his long standing vegetable growing award winning Pop!

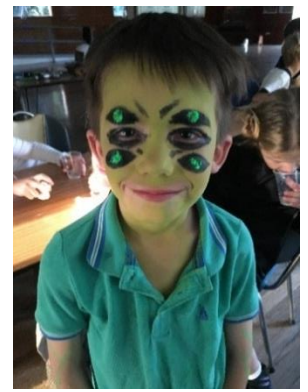
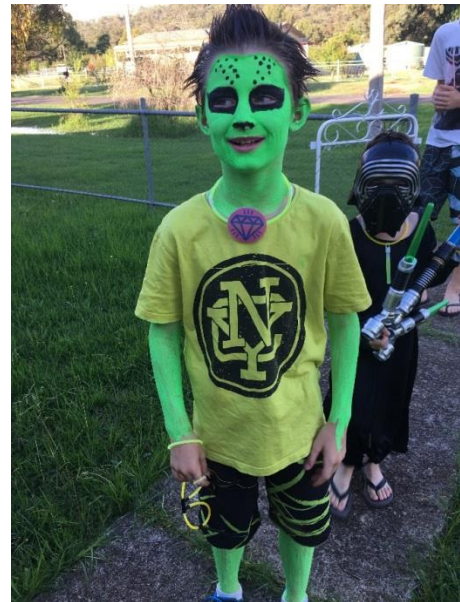
