
Responsible Ownership of Pets Program



Social Skills


Halloween Disco Report

Ages: This program is suitable for children enrolling in kindergarten in 2025.



Chaplain's Report

So much happening this term! Narnia is filling my mind - I often wake up singing one of the songs, and students and staff hear me humming them at school! It is wonderful to hear the students reciting their lines and adding the expression needed to make their part come to life.

In Sewing Club, students are nearing the completion of the first project of a hand-stitched pincushion, designed by the students. I loved seeing the look on Emma's face as she turned her work right side out after stitching the front to the back. Sometimes things don't make much sense (like sewing with the right sides together and the side we want to be seen is hidden!) until we see a bigger picture. This can take a lot of trust.

And that leads me to eSafety, as there is a lot of trust involved in using online platforms and ensuring your child remains safe.

Cyberbullying

Cyberbullying is when someone is mean to a child or young person online so they feel bad or upset. Online bullying can be devastating for young people, whose online activities are a key part of their identity and how they communicate.

Key points:

If your child is being cyberbullied, you might feel like you want to stop them using devices, but that can mean they miss out on important experiences. This page outlines some other options.

You can report cyberbullying to the platform where it's happening, and to eSafety if it's severe.

If you decide to report the cyberbullying, or think you may need to later, first collect evidence like screenshots.

Healthy Recipe

Creamy Mushroom Pasta Serves 2

Ingredients:

Fettuccine (or pasta of your choice) Olive oil Oyster mushrooms, torn or sliced 2 cloves of garlic, diced 1 sprig rosemary 150ml light thickened cream 2 tsp vegetable stock powder Toasted pine nuts

Method:

- Cook pasta in a large saucepan of boiling, salted water, following packet directions, until tender. Drain.
- 2. Meanwhile, heat olive oil in a large frying pan over medium heat. Cook the mushrooms and garlic, stirring, for 3 minutes or until tender.
- 3. Reduce heat to medium-low. Add cream, rosemary, and sprinkle across vegetable stock powder while stirring. You can add baby spinach in this step if you like.
- 4. Season with pepper and add a little cream or stock powder if needed to taste.
- Add pasta to the pan and toss until heated through.
- Sprinkle it with toasted pine nuts and serve.

Mushroom Report

Having successfully grown some beautiful and delicious button mushrooms last term, this term we are trying some more exotic mushrooms: white, gold and pink oyster mushrooms and Lion's Mane. The first crop of Pink Oysters were harvested this week and the students had the chance to try them in a yummy pasta dish.
